About us

The Institute of National Historical and Artistic Heritage - IPHAN is the entity that has the attribution of formulating public policies in the field of Cultural Heritage at the federal level. The institution has been operating for eighty years in the protection and preservation of material heritage assets, as well as in the safeguarding of manifestations, celebrations and knowledge regarding Brazilian cultural identity.

Since its creation in 1937, IPHAN has been working to preserve the heritage of the Guaraní Jesuit Missions in Rio Grande do Sul by recognizing and protecting it through federal legislation to preserve the remaining structures of the Guarani Jesuit-Guarani mission Miguel Arcanjo. During the institutional action, other remnants of the missionary settlements of the Jesuit republic of Paraguay, located in Brazilian territory and denominated Seven Towns of the Missions, were recognized as National Cultural Patrimony. Of the seven villages, four are preserved and administered directly by IPHAN: Archaeological Site of São Miguel Arcanjo, São João Batista, São Lourenço Mártir and São Nicolau. In 1983, the town of São Miguel was declared World Heritage by UNESCO along with the old missionary settlements of San Ignacio Mini, Nuestra Señora de Loreto, Santana and Santa María Mayor in Argentina. In 2014, with the registration of intangible cultural heritage, the Tava - Guaraní cultural reference point, is recognized the indigenous relevance, the meanings and values attributed by the M'bya Guaraní to the site of São Miguel Arcanjo.

With the objective of promoting territorial management in an integrated way between cultural and environmental heritage, repositioning heritage assets as socio-cultural and economic assets, involving the different local agents and sharing responsibilities, emerged, in 2009, the proposal for the creation of the National Historical Park of the Misiones - PHNM. The concept of management of National Historical Park needs to be deepened as well as the territorial approach with the concept of Cultural Landscape. In this sense, the PHNM consolidation project is proposed as a pilot in the field of IPHAN.

Event Objectives

The proposed international seminar aims to deepen the discussions and knowledge about good practices in territorial management of landscapes, historical and cultural parks with the participation of managers of sites worldwide recognized.

In this regard, IPHAN, in collaboration with the Andalusian Institute for Historic Heritage (IAPH), proposes, among other actions, an International Seminar to enable the presentation, discussion and exchange of experiences of cases of good practices in Cultural Heritage, in public policies related to the approach of the cultural landscape and in the formulation of historical and cultural parks that contribute to the consolidation of the Historical Park of the Missions in Brazil.

With the dissemination of international management experiences in different contexts and realities - Latin America and the Caribbean, Europe, North America and Australia, it is hoped to generate the conceptual, methodological and practical bases for the elaboration of the management plan of the National Historical Park of the Misiones, included as a pilot project of a patrimonial model of National Historic Parks at the national level.

Scope of the Seminar

International Seminar related to the theme of Cultural Heritage management with a focus on expanding the heritage notion through the concept of Cultural Landscape and the integration between cultural and environmental heritage.

The Misiones region, made up of 26 municipalities located in the northwest of the Rio Grande do Sul province in southern Brazil, borders Argentina and Uruguay. As a transboundary region, it encompasses a cultural richness that exceeds the geographical boundaries, with strong influence of the Hispanic domain in the colonial period and, at the same time, represents a great importance for the cultural references of the Guaraní, that inhabit that territory since ancestral times.

The cultural heritage related to the historical period of the Jesuit Missions Guaraní includes territories of Brazil, Argentina, Uruguay, Paraguay and Bolivia. In this way, the integration of this common heritage is approached by the IPHAN along with the Cultural Itinerary Project of the Missions in the scope of Cultural MERCOSUR.


